





HOUSING & ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITIES

In that capacity, he led strategy, deployment and management of the City's housing policy and U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) entitlement funding. Before coming to Detroit, Jemison served as Deputy Undersecretary and Deputy Director, Department of Housing and Community Development, for the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.



Anika Goss is the Executive Director of Detroit Future City (DFC), a think-anddo tank focused on land use and economic development in Detroit. Since taking the helm of DFC, Anika has repositioned the organization to be laser-focused on the equitable implementation of its community and economic development and land use and sustainability priorities. She has led the development of several significant research studies, including the 2019 release of "Growing Detroit's African-American Middle Class" comprehensive data report supporting attraction, retention and growth strategies as well as benchmark through which the African-American middle class can serve as a measure to track Detroit's equitable growth.
