



# DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

- Until 1871 there were multiple districts: Georgetown, Washington City, and Washington County
- Alexandria Retrocession in 1846
- Territorial governement ends in 1874
- No self-governance again until Home Rule Act of 1973
- First Black mayor in 1974 Walter E. Washington

- In 1970, Black Washingtonians comprised 71 percent of the District
- By 2011 the Black resident population decreased to 49.2 percent
- In 1943, DC's greatest population of more than 900,000 residents was reached and then continued to decline through 2000
- A push for new residents was initatiaed by Mayor Anthony Williams in 2003




