Heavy rain and snowfall, fires, wind – across the country and the globe, communities are grappling with the impacts of extreme weather events. The Lewis Center is working to help identify <u>strategies for protecting lives and property</u> and enhance long-term community resilience.

- Our hearts are with Los Angeles as the city deals with losses from the wildfires. As bigger, hotter, and more frequent wildfires cause increasing amounts of community trauma, infrastructure destruction, and economic hardship, the Center's report <u>Firebreak: Wildfire Resilience Strategies for Real Estate</u> and other resources identify opportunities to respond to fire risks with building design, land use policy, and community resilience solutions.
- From Texas and Virginia to the United Kingdom, extreme cold, snow, ice, and freezing rain events are causing power outages, disrupting travel, and threatening the health and wellbeing of residents. <u>Cold Snap: Extreme Cold and Real Estate</u>, addresses the risks posed to real estate by extreme cold related hazards and offers potential mitigation measures to consider as part of a resilient portfolio.




<u>Cold Snap: Extreme Cold and Real</u> <u>Estate.</u>

Extreme cold and winter storms can cause tremendous damage, disruption, and loss of life. Damage from the five costliest winter storms from 2013 to 2022 totaled nearly \$50 billion. The Lewis Center's new report, Cold Snap, introduces real estate owners, developers, and investors to the risks posed to real estate by extreme cold and other hazards typically associated with winter, presents the business case for cold-resilient buildings, and identifies potential mitigation measures.



<u>City of Melbourne Net Zero Imperative</u> TAP report

The City of Melbourne asked ULI to identify opportunities to incentivize retrofits and Zero Carbon Precinct engagement, and to offer key recommendations to help the city achieve its stated objectives and decarbonization ambitions.
